
Section One: Bethany Hamilton Biography

Athlete (1990 -)

Bethany Hamilton overcame the loss of her left arm in a shark attack to become a champion surfer and inspirational public figure.

Synopsis (Summary)

Born in Hawaii in 1990, Bethany Hamilton began competitive surfing at age 8. Raised in a surfing family, along with older brothers, Noah and Tim, Hamilton learned to handle the waves at an early age. She began competitive surfing at age 8, and by age 9 she had earned her first





On the morning of October 31, 2003, Hamilton went out to surf at Tunnels Beach in Ha'ena with her best friend, Alana Blanchard, and Blanchard's father and brother. While lying on her board, Hamilton suddenly felt intense pressure on her left arm and was pulled back and forth for a few seconds before the *flurry* passed. Initially feeling no pain, she noticed the water around her had turned red, and her shocked friends realized that her left arm had been severed nearly to the shoulder.

Blanchard's father made a quick *tourniquet* using his surfboard leash and led everyone to shore. Hamilton was rushed to Wilcox Memorial Hospital. Although she lost approximately 60 percent of her blood following the attack and underwent several surgeries, she was stabilized and released after a few weeks

As the story drew national attention, it was determined that Hamilton had been attacked by a 14-foot tiger shark. Seemingly level-headed about the incident and the loss of her left arm at the shoulder, she vowed to return to surfing as soon as possible.



Section Three: Tiger Shark Information

DESCRIPTION

This shark is one of the largest that inhabit the oceans. It has dark stripes on its skin similar to those of the land Tigers. It possesses an excellent sense of sight as well as smell.

DISTRIBUTION AND HABITAT

The tiger shark is found in tropical and subtropical waters around the world. It is a saltwater species and often approaches the coasts that have shallow waters. It does not always stay in one place, so its habitat is changing.

FEEDING

The tiger shark's diet is made up of fish, molluscs, crustaceans, sea turtles, seabirds and even mammals such as the dugong. It also consumes small sharks and the remains of dead whales or can even attack wounded sea creatures.



Tiger sharks have an enormous appetite and can eat almost anything they find in their path. That is why, if they run into non-edible objects or junk, they do not hesitate to eat them even without trying them first. They can camouflage with the environment and thus easily trap their prey.
