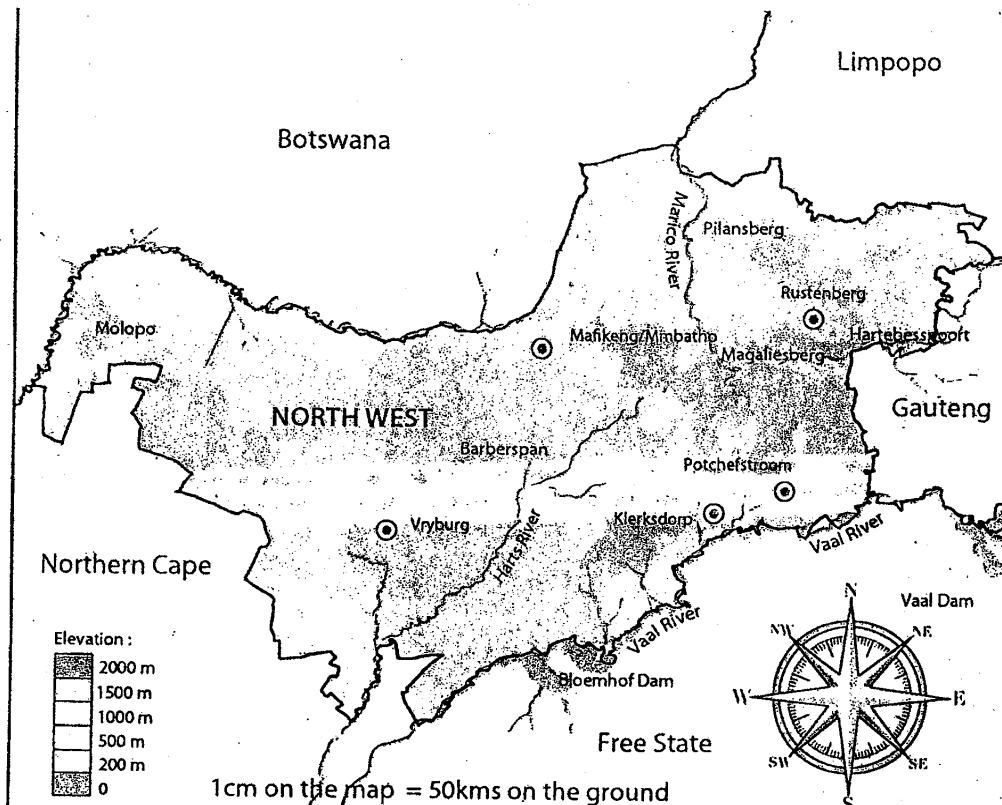
Answer the following questions:

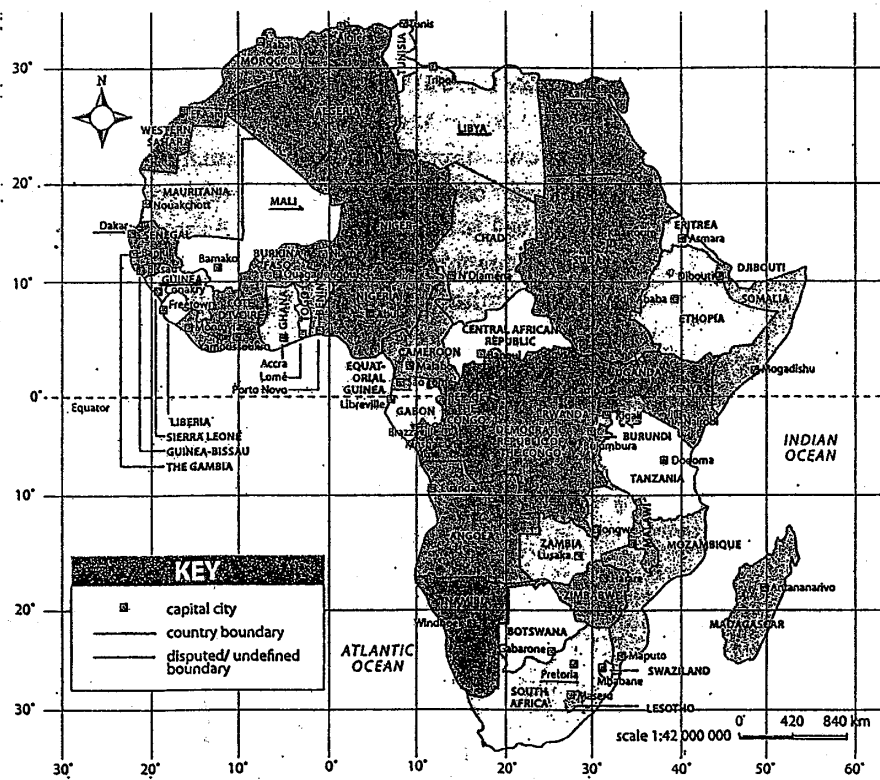
